A View from Calvary

Walk in Christ

My wife and I try to exercise three times a week. I wish we could do more. A few years ago, we became members at the local YMCA which is a great facility that has many sophisticated machines like treadmills, elliptical cross trainers, exercise bikes and the like. However, I kept thinking to myself that if we could walk outdoors, why did we need those machines? I think it is about an **environment** where people are encouraged to do something together. People are walking together. People are running together. Sweating together. Cycling together ...etc.

Lately my sermons have been based on the letter to the Colossians that can be summarized in one sentence: Walk IN CHRIST; Live IN CHRIST; Exercise IN CHRIST.

Paul described Jesus Christ as a cosmic reality (first chapter). Then he arrived to these images:

"Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so <u>walk in him</u>, <u>rooted</u> and <u>built up</u> in him and <u>established</u> in the faith, just as you <u>were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.</u>" (Colossians 2:6-7)

Walk in HIM (ESV translation). The NIV translates it: "continue to live your lives in him." The original Greek word is "walking around." Therefore, we can combine them as follows: "Continue walking around IN HIM."

This means the believers of Colossae were already walking in Christ. Yet, Paul is encouraging them to continue walking without stopping. Paul is worried about false teachers who could divert the walkers from their path. Just walking is not enough. Walking without a purpose will be a life full of activities, yet missing CHRIST and his mission.

It is funny that when we are at the gym we walk and walk on the treadmill without going anywhere. But, in fact, there is a goal in that walk. The machine will show you your heartbeat; you can go faster and then find the right pace for your exercise. There is a goal we pursue in that walk.

Paul wants the church to walk with a purpose. "Continue walking around...yet IN HIM." This means we will walk in the morning starting from our beds. We will walk to the kitchen for our breakfast. We will walk to our

car. We will walk towards our jobs. We will walk during the day. We will walk during exercise. We will live our daily life walking IN CHRIST.

I encourage you this summer season to Walk in CHRIST rooted in His Word. May God lead you daily to realize that "whatever you do, in word or deed, you do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (Colossians 3:17)


A Visit to Armenian Evangelical Church of Beyoglu, Istanbul

On July 1, 1846, 40 members of the 'Society of Piety', thirty seven men and three women, founded the first Armenian Evangelical church in Pera (present Beyoglu) section of Istanbul, and elected Apisoghom Eutudjian as their first pastor.

Having grown up in an Armenian Evangelical home, I was always intrigued and wanted to visit the church where the Armenian Evangelical movement had started. During my previous visits to Istanbul, I had visited the Armenian Evangelical church (Gedik Pasa) and the Emmanuel church in the 'Bible House' building, but had no opportunity to visit the 'Amenasurp Yerrortutyun' Armenian Evangelical church in Beyoglu, as it is officially known today.

During our recent visit to Istanbul my wife and I had the opportunity to visit with Mrs. Rakel Dink, who after finding my desire to see the Armenian Evangelical church in Beyoglu, graciously agreed to take us and show the church.

The impressive building of the Armenian Evangelical church, which is located in the Aynalicesme section of Beyoglu, was built between 1905 &1907. Even though there was no church service, we did visit the beautiful interior of the church (see Mrs. Dink's and Arpi's picture)



Tifetime Servie Recognitions

During our 86th Anniversary Banquet we honored seven members from our congregation (Edward & Gloria Medzian, Vehanoush Nazarian, Yevnige Salibian, Ardson & Gladys Shegoian and Sam Yeramian). In succeeding Issues of The Messenger we are going to include remembrances from the honorees.

Edward and Gloria Medzian

Ed grew up in Fresno, and Gloria grew up in Michigan. Both sets of their parents were from Khapert, in historic Armenia. Gloria and Ed grew up going to church and that is how they accepted the Lord. Ed went to

the Pilgrim Armenian Congregational Church in Fresno and Gloria to the Armenian Congregational Church in Detroit.



Ed went to college at UCSF and was in their pharmacy program. He was attending Calvary Church, even before Calvary had its own building. At the time, Calvary rented from other churches. After graduating, Ed was in the service for 4 years, during World War II.

While he was in Officers' Candidates School, during the summer of 1943, he was on leave to visit his mother in Fresno. He was walking on the street and met up with someone he's gone to elementary school with. The classmate had a cousin, Gloria, in Detroit, and encouraged Ed to go and meet her.

Ed was stationed in Michigan, in the military police. Indeed, he did visit the Armenian Congregational Church, where Gloria

was a Sunday school teacher. He knew immediately that this was the woman he was going to marry. They spent time together while Ed was stationed in Michigan. Ed was also able to visit Pastor Kartozian, who had been the minister of Calvary in San Francisco and had moved to Michigan to be pastor there.

Ed was sent overseas to North Africa. Before he left, he gave one of his gold bars to Gloria (he was a Second Lieutenant by this time) as kind of a promise ring. When he returned from North Africa, he and Gloria got engaged. They were married at an army base 6 months later. They made their home in Texas, where Ed was teaching at Officer Candidate School. Ed was then sent to the Pacific to prepare for the invasion of Japan. Gloria stayed with family in Detroit. Thankfully, the war was soon over. Ed and Gloria moved back to California and to the Bay Area. Ed was happy to return to Calvary Church. Calvary bought its first property, on 38th Avenue, in 1948. Pastor Kartozian came back from Detroit, too, and was the pastor at Calvary again.

At Calvary, Ed was on the church council. He served as Moderator for twelve years. He and Gloria were involved in many different aspects, with Gloria involved in the ladies' group.

Advice to the coming generations from the Medzians:

Attend church as much as possible. Go to church to worship the Lord but also to provide love and friendship and a strong family unit for your fellow members.
