attended every day for one month in the


they could do to keep themselves busy. The church provided Christian education and a healthy environment. I am happy to share that we have been supporting them for the last 6 years.

All the Armenian Evangelical churches of Aleppo were able to have summer programs for the kids. CACC supported Vacation Bible School at the Martyrs' church. Even though it looked impossible and unsafe to do anything for the children of the war-stricken city, yet more than 150 neighborhood kids came to church every day. I am proud of the dedicated volunteers who took the risk to run this project. I am thankful to God for protecting them every single day. They were laterally protected. On a busy day at VBS, and just after the kids had left for their homes, a rocket hit the next building destroying walls and windows. Thank God there were no injuries. I am thankful to all of you who financially supported this church in those tough times. Through your donations, we were able not only to run the program, but also to provide some nutritious food items for the families.

Coming back to our theme, we need to grow. It is not numbers that we are seeking. Christ wants faithful servants who are ready to be His disciples. **Plug** in to one of our Bible study groups because you need a small group to learn, share and grow. Therefore, **grow downward, upward, inward and outward**. Amen


### Vacation Bible Camp

On the due date, as we were expecting more than eighty children, we were blessed with more than 140 children, 48 of them were from Arm. Evang. Torossian School, and the rest came from other schools. They gathered every morning, from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm to have their worship time, the Bible lesson, hear other stories, make handcrafts, and also have outdoor activities. The Bible lesson was based on Ephesians 6:11-18, especially on the verse that says: "Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil." The children were trained to be warriors for God by wearing the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the shoes of the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit. ## Annual Picnic

Given the fact that there were thousands of people who had followed Jesus to that place and were

now starting to get hungry, we were asked to consider what type of reactions we might likely have under the circumstances of seeing such a situation unfold. Would we be

eager, like the crowds of people following Jesus, to see if He would perform any more miraculous signs - like the ones they had already seen him perform on other occasions? Would we be more likely to see the situation overly pragmatically - and even slightly pessimistically, as with human eyes (like the disciples Philip and Andrew did) - not seeing



how anyone could possibly feed thousands of people with such little available food out on that mountain? Could we even imagine what Jesus might possibly do with the 5 barley loaves and two small fish that belonged to the young lad in the crowd? The exercise of considering our reactions, our attitudes





and our thought-processes under such circumstances was effective

in making us see how we would do well to trust Jesus in even the most seemingly impossible circumstances; and how we might want to confidently and eagerly anticipate that His power is able to accomplish much more than we can even imagine...maybe even having loads of crumbs to spare within our lives, too!

Overall, it was a great day to learn more about Him who can accomplish all things, to enjoy His creation, and to be thankful for the many ways He continues to provide for us and our well being. Many thanks to Mr. Armen Beylerian for leading the planning and organization of this year's picnic. We gratefully

acknowledge him and the many volunteers who worked together there and behind-the-scenes to contribute to the wonderful success of this year's CACC Annual Picnic. We praise God for His provision, and give Him all the glory!



On August 24th this year, the members of our Church Council and Deacons savored the valuable opportunity to gather together for a beneficial 3-fold purpose: 1) to celebrate and give thanks for the fruit of God's work at CACC during the past year; 2) to look forward to how we might serve God's mission for us in the coming year;

and 3) to find personal refreshment in Him as we spent time (together and in solitude) reflecting, evaluating and praying with anticipation that His Spirit will work mightily within our congregation in the year to come and beyond.

The theme for the day called us to "Dwell in the Word". It drew its proposal from the teaching of Colossians 3:15 which asks believers to "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...". Letting the word dwell in us necessitates that we first go to the word regularly and spend time in it; absorbing it so that we can give it an opportunity to dwell



richly in us. It requires us to take positive action to keep studying and learning the word of Christ so that it can continually be on our minds and in our hearts. Only then does it have a chance to dwell in us like that.

The invitation doesn't intend merely to be a suggestion. It's a bold challenge given to all believers that we take the time to get to know His word and listen carefully to it. It is a plea that we ponder God's word deeply and meditate upon it prayerfully so that it will have ample opportunity to take hold in our hearts and minds in order to dwell there.

May it be our objective to go to the word frequently, habitually, and as a matter of usual practice. And, may we have the desire to linger in it - earnestly seeking to understand what God is saying through it. The petition we are given urges us to take pause in His word and tarry there - staying, resting and essentially hanging out in His word as much as possible so that we will have the opportunity to listen to Him, learn His thoughts, know Him more deeply and truly be able to abide in Him! What a great return on investment waits for us there!

During the retreat, our attention focused on two specific passages of Scripture: first, in 2 Corinthians 3:12-18, we recollected and evaluated last year's theme of "Being transformed into His image"; then, we went to Colossians 2:6-7, to spend time examining and contemplating what it means to "Be rooted, strengthened, and overflowing with thankfulness" - the goal being (for us, and all believers) to grow deeper and stronger in Christian maturity, and bear fruit for Christ's Kingdom with abundant thankfulness to Him. May God accomplish all of this as He wills for His Glory.

The retreat wrapped-up as we considered and gratefully acknowledged the many blessings God has given us -both individually and as a congregation. It was a worthwhile exercise to write down some of those blessings to enable us to take-in what amazing good God has specifically accomplished (and continues to provide) for us. And, in that spirit, we thank Eff & Patti Martin for graciously allowing us to hold this gathering in their lovely guest cottage. The setting added much to our ability to attain the purposes intended. We were also privileged to have Rev. James Gaderlund, retired pastor of Foothill Covenant Church in Los Altos, CA lead us through many of the activities of the day. His guidance and insight - in concert with the direction and supervision of Badveli Nerses Balabanian - served us well. We wholeheartedly acknowledge and thank both of them for their work among us - knowing that they, too, give all the glory to God.
